Lesson Title: New Thing

Scripture Reference: Isaiah 43

SUMMARY: God is doing a new thing in and through our lives. He is faithful to bring us through to new blessings and new seasons. He brings us through dry, desert, places, and brings us into rivers of life in Him. We do not have to be afraid, even when we go through trying circumstances, because the LORD promises to protect us from destruction.

Important Concepts

- The LORD loves us.
- We are precious to Him.
- He takes our lives and gives us new things and does new things through us.
- When God blesses us in these ways, we give Him all of the praise and worship.

Discussion Questions

- Was there ever a time when you felt you needed a second chance?
- What was that story and how did it end – did you end up getting that second chance?

- Have you ever gotten something that was totally brand new?
- How did it feel to get the new thing?
- What is a renewed mind/ mindset?

Application

- Share a story of a new thing that God did in your life.

Object Lesson: Yeshua Cleanses Our Bad Thoughts - renewed mind

Supplies needed: bowl of water, black pepper and liquid dish soap

The bowl of water represents our thoughts/ brain. The pepper represents our bad thoughts and the soap represents Yeshua (Jesus). Shake the pepper into the bowl. Glve examples of some of the bad thoughts we may have or allow the kids to share. (I can't do anything right. Mom or Dad doesn't love me. It's okay to tell a lie; no one will ever know.) The more pepper in the bowl makes for a greater demonstration. Ask Yeshua to come into our thought life. Squirt the soap into the middle of the bowl and the pepper immediately rushes to the edges of the bowl making the water (our thoughts) clear and clean. Yeshua pushes our bad thoughts away and renews our mind so we can think good, excellent thoughts - what is true, noble, honorable, full of peace, praiseworthy.

Option 2: Place a hurricane cylinder into a deep dish (roasting pan). Fill the cylinder with rocks and black ping pong balls. The rocks represent good/ positive thoughts. The ping pong balls represent bad / negative thoughts. Pour water into the cylinder. The water represents Yeshua cleansing us by the Ruach HaKodesh (Holy Spirit) and the Word of God. The cylinder represents our brain / thoughts. As water is poured into the cylinder the ping pong balls begin to float and are eventually carried out of the cylinder by the water.

Craft / Art Center: Playdough

But the pot he was shaping from the clay was marred in his hands; so the potter formed it into another pot, shaping it as seemed best to him. Jeremiah 18:4

Therefore if anyone is in Messiah, he is a new creation. The old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new. 2 Corinthians 5:17

Give each child a lump of playdough, enough to make a pot. Share from Scripture how God told Jeremiah to go to the Potter's house and watch as he made a piece of pottery. Jeremiah watched how the clay formed the shape of a pot but then something happened and it fell apart. Then the potter made it again into something new. God does the same thing with our lives. He is the Master Artist and has a beautiful plan for all of us, but sin keeps us from becoming the beautiful creation God has in mind. But praise God for Yeshua who makes us new. When we receive Yeshua into our lives we become new creations. God makes us new again. The old is gone and all things are new.

Group Game

Musical Chairs Meeting Friends

Make two rows of chairs facing each other. Each row needs the same number of chairs and you need one chair for every person playing. For instance if you have 20 players then you need 20 chairs, two rows of ten chairs each. Divide the players into two groups. When the music starts each group will walk in a circle around their row of chairs. One group will walk clockwise. The other groups will walk counter clockwise. When the music stops, the player will sit in the chair closest to them and talk to the person across from them. It might be helpful to have an adult give a conversation topic (What's your favorite animal? Share about a time you went on a trip.) After about one minute the music resumes and the players begin walking in a circle again. Adults can remove chairs if they wish. If you remove chairs, make sure to remove one chair from each row at the same time. When the music stops the players need to sit in the chairs closest to them and talk to a new friend sitting across from them. Play can continue until everyone has a chance to speak with someone from the opposite circle or until only two players are left (one from each circle.)

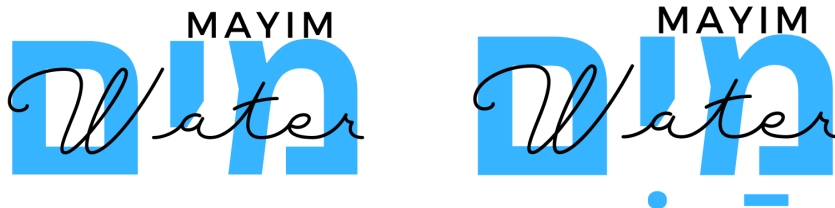

Lesson Title: Trust God in the Water

Scripture Reference: Naaman Healed from Leprosy / 2 Kings 5:1-19 and Miracle of Yeshua Calming the Storm / Matthew 8:23-27; Mark 4:35-41; Luke 8:22-25

SUMMARY: Naaman was the commander of the Aram army, a mighty man of valor, esteemed in the eyes of the king. The LORD had given him and the Aram army victory over Israel and he had taken a young Israelite girl captive to be a servant to his wife. Naaman had leprosy. The young servant girl told her mistress about the prophet Elisha in Samaria. She knew the prophet of God could cure Naaman of his leprosy. The king of Aram sent a letter and gold pieces with Naaman to the king of Israel requesting he be cured of leprosy. Elisha heard that Naaman had gone to the king and sent word for the king to send Naaman to him. Naaman came to Elisha's house with all his horses and chariots and Elisha sent a messenger out to him and told him to go wash in the Jordan River. Naaman became angry and left in a rage. His pride was standing in the way of him receiving the cure. His servants reasoned with him and Naaman did humble himself and go and wash in the Jordan. After dipping seven times, his skin was restored to that of a child. He was clean and healed. Naaman gave praise to the God of Israel for his complete healing. God made his skin new. Sometimes we are asked to do things that simply do not make sense. Often we are asked to humbly obey instead of doing what seems right in our own eyes. God is trustworthy. He will fulfill the word He has spoken to us.

Important Concepts

- God heals
- God may do things in ways that seem strange or even embarrassing to us at times
- In this case, God used waters as part of healing Naaman

Discussion Questions

- Why did Naaman not listen to Elisha at first?
- How did Naaman want God to heal him at first?
- What are some things that people need healing from?
- What are some things that you or someone you know needs healing from?
- What does water do? What are ways that water is used?

Application

- Has there been a time when God healed you or someone you know?
- Pray for healing
- Be washed by physical water
- Be washed by the “waters” of God’s Ruach HaKodesh
- Trust God

Object Lesson: Trusting God

Supplies: plastic ziplock bag filled with water, several sharpened pencils, person willing to trust!

Preparation:

It’s hard to trust an invisible God but He is SO worthy of our trust. Ask for a volunteer. Ask the volunteer if they trust you. Then ask if they trust that you won’t spill the bag of water over their head. Next ask if you can hold the bag of water over their head and stick a pencil through the bag. Do they still trust that you won’t get them wet? Tell them that you will poke a hole in the bag with the pencil and they will not get wet. Proceed to poke the pencil through the bag all the way through to the other side. Then say would you trust that you won’t get wet if I poked another pencil through this bag? How about another? Continue to poke pencils through as you ask.

Sometimes in life things happen that hurt. We get sick. A family member or friend moves away. A pet dies. (You may want to ask the kids to share about things that have happened to them that have hurt.) It may not make sense to trust God, just like it didn’t make sense that we wouldn’t get wet if a pencil was poked through a bag of water. It did not make sense to Naaman to go and bathe in the Jordan River seven times to be healed from his leprosy. But we can trust God and we can trust His Word. He loves us and cares for us and wants good things for our lives.

(Here's the science behind how this works: The plastic bag is a polymer, a large molecule made up of many repeating units. When you poke the pencil through the bag the polymer rearranges itself to close the gap between the pencil and the bag keeping the water inside.)

Craft / Art Rotation: Water Bottle Craft

Supplies: small water bottle, water, blue food coloring, baby oil, hul from wax of Babybel cheese, tape for sealing the lid, label with Bible Verse*

Instructions: Fill a small water bottle halfway to $\frac{2}{3}$ full of water. Add a few drops of blue food coloring and shake. Place the cheese hul boat through the opening. Add baby oil to fill. Secure lid with tape. Dry the outside of the water bottle and place a label with Isaiah 43:2 scripture portion. * Instead of typing and pre printing these on labels you can provide strips of paper for the children to write the verse themselves and tape to the outside of the bottle.

Group Game: Water Balloon Toss

Materials needed: water balloon for each pair of children and a large outside area

Divide the children into pairs. Each pair receives one water balloon. Players will stand toe to toe across from their partner. When the game starts they toss the balloons back and forth to each other. Each time they catch the balloon both players take a step backwards. If they drop the balloon but it doesn't bust they get to start over again. When the balloon busts the pair is out of the game. The winners are the pair who move the farthest distance apart without their balloon breaking.

DAY 3

Lesson Title: Walk Through the Fire

Scripture Reference: Daniel 3 / Hebrew Children thrown in the Fiery Furnace

SUMMARY: King Nebuchadnezzar of Babylon made a large statue of gold. He summoned all the government authorities in the provinces to assemble for the dedication of the statue. Everyone gathered and stood at the foot of the giant statue. They were commanded to fall down and worship the golden image when they heard the musical instruments. The punishment for not bowing down to the statue was being burned alive that same hour in a furnace. Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego were appointed administrators in the province of Babylon. They were Jewish and they worshiped the God of Israel. They openly did not serve the gods of King Nebuchadnezzar, nor would they bow down to his golden statue. This infuriated the king. He threatened to throw them into the blazing furnace. Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego told the king they did not have to give him an answer, but that their God could deliver them from the furnace, but even if He didn't they would still not bow down and worship the golden idol. Nebuchadnezzar became so enraged his countenance changed. He ordered the furnace to be heated seven times hotter and for the men to be tied with ropes and thrown into the fire (still

wearing their clothes.) The furnace was so hot that the men carrying out his orders to throw them into the fire died. However, when King Nebuchadnezzar looked into the furnace there were four men, all walking around unbound and unharmed. The fourth man looked to him to have the appearance of a deity. King Nebuchadnezzar called Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego to come out of the fire. When everyone gathered around they saw the fire had no effect on them, their hair, their clothing... they did not even smell like smoke! King Nebuchadnezzar blessed the God of Israel and gave Him praise for delivering His servants. He then made a decree that any person, nation or language that slanders the God of Israel would be killed and their homes destroyed, because the God of Israel is the only God who delivers.

Important Concepts

- God sometimes puts us in / allows tests and trials into our lives
- There are times when we need to stand up to the world and demonstrate that we trust God
- God delivered and saved Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego
- They didn't even smell of smoke – there was no negative effect that stuck on them
- The faith of Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego led to King Nebuchadnezzar praising the God of Israel

Discussion Questions

- Have you ever felt pressure to do what the world wanted instead of doing what God wants?
- Do people set up / have idols today?
- What were some of the results of Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego trusting and obeying God?
- What are some results of you standing up and showing that you are on God's side?

Application

- What are ways that you need to “walk through the fire” in your own life?
- Has God ever delivered / rescued you from a “fiery furnace” type experience?
- Praise God for saving and delivering us

Object Lesson: On Fire for Yeshua

Supplies: two \$10 bills, towel, lighter, 91% rubbing alcohol, water, salt, glass bowl, metal tongs, fire extinguisher (just in case!)

Preparation: Fill the glass bowl with 1/2 cup of 91% rubbing alcohol, 1/2 cup of water, and 1/4 tsp of salt. Allow the \$10 bill to soak in the bowl for at least 5 minutes while you talk.

Hold up the \$10 bill. This is valuable isn't it? What would happen if I lit this \$10 bill on fire? (It would burn.)

Let's say YOU are this \$10 bill. You are valuable to God. He created you. He created me. But because of sin, we deserve death. The wages of sin is death BUT the free gift of God is eternal life through Yeshua, Jesus. God sent Yeshua, Jesus, the Living Water, to save us from burning.

Put the \$10 bill in the clear liquid “water”. Show the bowl with the money in it.

When you receive the free gift of eternal life through Yeshua, Jesus, the Ruach haKodesh (Holy Spirit) will indwell you to guide you to help you make decisions and to keep you from sinning. Just like this \$10 bill is immersed in the water, you need to soak yourself by reading the Bible, going to synagogue or church, praying, humbling yourself, seeking Yeshua, listening to praise and worship music. This will help you stay connected to God and help you to be empowered by His Ruach haKodesh. Then you will be ready when the Ruach wants to burn in your heart and tell you to do something, or teach you something new. In our lesson Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego were able by faith to take a stand for God because they had been staying connected to Him through prayer, obeying Scriptures, remaining humble etc. Their love and devotion to God was tested, to the point of being put to death but they still chose to only worship Adonai, the One true God.

Use the tongs to lift the \$10 bill out of the water solution. Use the lighter to light the \$10 bill. The fire should burn off the alcohol and leave the bill solid, but wet. The “water” will not allow the bill to burn. The fire should flash quickly as it burns the alcohol.

Remember the flame you saw? What happened to the bill first? [The bill had to be soaked in the liquid and then the flame could burn without the bill burning up.]

The writer of the book of Hebrews tells us God is the All Consuming Fire. He wants to burn in your heart so that you will have the same power and boldness as Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego had when King Nebuchadnezzar threatened to throw them in the fiery furnace. God promises that He will protect us even when we are having to walk through very difficult times. By faith we can look to Him for help and strength to stand firm as we wait for Him to do something new in our lives.

Unless you are soaked in Yeshua, the fire of the Ruach haKodesh won't burn brightly. He might try to speak to you, correct you, and train you in the right things to do, but because you aren't soaked in Yeshua, you might miss Him. Are you distracted? What do you need to do today so you are soaked in Yeshua? Get soaked, then watch the Ruach haKodesh burn in you as you tell others the Good News!

Alternate Object Lesson: Will You Sink or Float?

Supplies: two clear pitchers filled with water; two oranges - one orange has the peeling removed

Instructions: Show the children the two pitchers of water and the two oranges, one with the peel and one without. Ask the children to make guesses about what will happen when the oranges are dropped in the water. Will they sink? Will they float? Will one sink and the other float? Which orange will be the one that floats?

Drop the oranges in the water pitchers. The orange with the peeling will float, while the orange without the peeling will sink. The peeling protects the orange from absorbing the water so it is able to stay afloat while the peeled orange soaks up all the water as it sinks to the bottom of the pitcher. God covered Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego with His protection when they were faced with a challenging situation. They chose to trust that God's plan was the best and did not let fear of the fiery furnace get in the way of doing what was right and honorable. They chose to obey God not knowing what the outcome would be, if God would save them. When they chose to obey God other people saw the choices that they made and the way they lived their lives. This gave them the opportunity to show that their God was the one true God because of how they lived their life. God did not leave them in the fire. He was right there with them to protect and shield them from the flaming furnace. In the same way God rescues and protects us too through Yeshua. Yeshua's blood covers and atones for our sin, offering us eternal life. He protects us from experiencing eternal separation from God and also protects us in this world we live in. We will go through hard times and our faith may be tested but we can trust that God is always with us. When we trust Him and live boldly, keeping our eyes focused on Yeshua in the midst of hard times, people will notice that we are "floating" like the orange with the peeling, instead of sinking. This gives us an opportunity to show others that our God is real and He is the one true God.

Craft / Art Rotation: Paper Plate Craft

Supplies: paper plate, red, orange and yellow tissue paper or construction paper, glue, black marker

Instructions: Tear the colored paper into small pieces and glue to the paper plate. Draw 4 people in the middle of the plate. Write the Bible verse on the plate.

"When you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you."
Isaiah 43:2

Group Game: Fire Ball

Materials needed: A soft ball (wrapped or decorated to resemble fire), music player.

Instructions:

Instructions: Participants stand or sit in a circle. Play music and have participants gently throw the fire ball to each other. When the music stops, the person holding the fire ball shares a way they can stand firm in their faith during difficult times. Discuss the significance of trusting God and supporting each other in times of trouble. Play several rounds, allowing multiple participants to share and engage in the discussion.

Materials: one plastic cup per player, hard surface, music

(This song starts slow and gradually speeds up.)

Sequence: Clap, Clap, Ta-ble, Ta-ble, Clap Up Down, Clap, Sweep, Top, Table, bottom, hand down
Start out really slow. “Clap clap” and then you’re going to hit the table with the syllables of table, “table table”. Clap again and then you’re going to pick the cup straight up and set it down. you’re going to clap again. Clap, then sweep the cup upside down. Sweep, hit the top, hit the table, grab the bottom, put your hand down, put the cup down. Now if you’re playing with other people, when you put the cup down is when you slide the cup over to the next person and grab your new cup.

Decorations

In the room you use for large group gatherings create a panoramic view of a desert landscape. Each day add a new element to the landscape based on the word and Scripture focus for the day. On Day 1, you need a barren landscape interspersed with cacti and a large sun. On Day 2 add water to represent streams. On Day 3 add a campfire and on Day 4 you can add silhouettes of people singing (represented by music notes) around the campfire.


You can also print posters of the Hebrew words and focal Scriptures to have available to use in the classrooms.

Messianic Dance Breakthrough Session

This year the Campers will learn two different dances. One dance is to “Mayim”, an Israeli folk song. The other is “New Thing” by Dr. Greg Silverman. “New Thing” is the theme / song for the Chadash curriculum and the choreography was developed by Marianna Dwinell. Messianic Dance is unique in that it embodies the compound unity of everyone joining together to go up to worship the Lord. Clapping and praise dancing are appropriate forms of worship however there is something special to join hands and worship the Lord together through same movement.

Even though “Mayim” is considered a folk song, its lyrics are based straight out of Scripture. This song is also where the mayim dance step derives its name. By learning the song and the affiliated dance the Campers are in a sense connecting to Jewish people all over the world who have been singing and dancing this exact song for many, many years. Having the dance expression will also help the Campers learn the music and rhythm and aid in singing. We encourage Messianic Dance Breakthrough Session Leaders to work on both songs every day during your teaching session.

Snack Chat Questions

Shepherds are encouraged to engage with their group to facilitate age appropriate intentional conversations during snack time we call "Snack Chat". "Snack Chat" is an opportunity for open ended discussion on topics about worship, God, the Good News, etc. and how these impact daily life. We also want to encourage Campers to use this time to share their testimonies of God working new things (chadash).

Day 1: Questions about Music (choose two)

Why did you want to come to Youth Worship Camp this year? What is something you hope to learn?

How does music impact your daily life?

If there is one thing you could instantly change about yourself as a musician, what would it be and why? What's preventing you from working on that change?

Who is your *favorite* musical artist or genre of music (not necessarily a Christian or faith based artist/ genre)? Do you have a favorite Messianic artist or song?

How do you feel when another person notices a quality or attribute about you or your music?

How do you handle someone giving you a compliment when you have sung or played a song during a worship service designed to give attention and praise to God?

Day 2: Questions about Worship (choose two)

Do you view worship as something that mainly happens at church or synagogue, or does it happen in other areas of your life?

Why do you think God is worth worshipping?

How does your relationship with God feel different when you spend time worshiping Him?

What does it mean to worship God? (Read or paraphrase Romans 12:1) How would your life change if you decided to live a lifestyle of true worship in reasonable service to God? Is there service to God that seems unreasonable to you?

Day 3: Questions about Prayer

How do you feel about prayer? Is it hard or easy for you?

What confuses you about prayer?

How often do you pray?

Is prayer important to you? Why or why not?

Day 4: Questions around Relationship with God

What does it mean for you to be created by God? How does that play out in your life, or does it?

How does someone follow Yeshua (Jesus)? What does it look like? More specifically, what does following Yeshua look like in your life?

When you have thoughts, feelings, images or words from others that seem to attack or overwhelm you what statements do you start to tell yourself? How do these line up with Scripture and what God says about you?
